



And if that didn't 'blow you away', did we mention Chelmsford is the birthplace of radio?



Unlocking capacity

You don't need to look very far to find evidence of how Chelmsford's ambitious plans to grow and develop are becoming a reality.

The first new railway station on the Great Eastern Main Line in 100 years is being constructed right here in Chelmsford. This is the second station for Chelmsford and compliments our existing offering, which is the UK's busiest two-platform railway station outside of London.

We are also driving forward improvements to our road networks, enhancing capacity and improving links. These works will see the installation of the longest curved multi-span bridge over land in England. A new North East bypass will also be created, providing a stronger connection between Chelmsford, London Stansted Airport and the wider area.

Take a walk through our city centre and down our fully pedestrianised High Street to to enjoy the result of a £10 million investment in public spaces. For something more energetic, visit our new state-of-the-art leisure facility, or experience Chelmsford by bike on one of our newly-enhanced cycle routes.



Brimming with talent

One of the key factors when deciding where to move to with your family is schooling, and Chelmsford is highly regarded for its educational offering.

There are 37 primary schools and 11 secondary schools within Chelmsford, many of which are highly rated. Also on offer is an impressive selection of grammar and independent schools, including King Edward VI Grammar School and the Chelmsford County High School for girls, both of which regularly achieve national recognition for their outstanding results.

Opportunities to study and achieve higher qualifications are also plentiful. With two leading higher education establishments on the doorstep in the form of Anglia Ruskin University (ARU) and Writtle University College and a dedicated further educational establishment at Chelmsford College.





